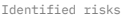


This phase considers activities such as:

Designit projects where DNH was applied

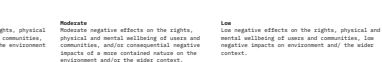
Read the prompts identified per each impact area.
Select the most applicable and most relevant to your project.
In the team, identify potential risks by answering the prompts.



Identify how likely and how critical the impact of your risks are. This is the base to craft the right measures and actions to counterbalance those risks.

Recommended actions:

Transfer the identified risks from the left, and group them if possible. Then map them on the matrix to work out the most severe risks from a social and environmental perspective and what are most likely to happen.



As you have your biggest and most impactful risks identified, it's time to assess what you can do about them:

Develop actions to counterbalance those risks (also called measures). Feel free to drag and drop some of the tips to build measures and make it more tailored and specific around your case.



To safeguard a follow up to the measures identified, allocate an owner to each measure and track progress over time.
